> Technically speaking the increase in the assessment residential properties should not affect your taxes since the District will simply adjust the residential mill rate accordingly. However, in practice it does not necessarily work out that way since not all properties are equally affected by the increase in the assessments and since the tax rate is based on the assessment, quite often it effects some people more adversely than others. There is of course also the perennial municipal tax increase which this year will be in the neighborhood of 4.5%. This does not include indirect increaes, which will push the final tax increase considerably higher.

> I will not support the budged for the simple reason that at a time when we cannot afford many desirable things for lack of money and at a time when we should keep taxes down, we continue to subsidize the City of North Vancouver without rhyme or reason via the Shared Services Agreement we have with them.

> In addition, District Council has consistently refused to re organize the Recreation Commission along the Parkgate model as I suggested and which would save the District taxpayers millions of dollars annually without, in any way, reducing the level of service or the cost to the users. These are political issues however, and unless the people in the District speak out, nothing will change, indeed the local press is partly to blame for this, for not informing the public about such crucial issues.
