> *Your e-mail to the District's Infoweb regarding water quality has been*
> *forwarded to me for response.*
>
> *We agree with the comments in your e-mail concerning the inferior*
> *quality of water that some District residents (those in the Seymour*
> *supply area) were receiving as a result of the Dec 9-10 storm. On the*
> *date you sent the e-mail, the GVRD was still supplying some areas of*
> *the District with Seymour water, due to supply system constraints*
> *(mostly related to elevation differences between the Capilano and*
> *Seymour sources, Seymour being the highest source). The District and*
> *the Medical Health Officer were insistent that a solution be found and*
> *on December 16 the GVRD was able to take the Seymour source completely*
> *out of service and supply all areas with clean Capilano and Coquitlam*
> *water. The GVRD system was not designed to be able to do this, and it*
> *is the first time since the Seymour dam was built that this has been*
> *accomplished. Should this situation ever arise again, the GVRD now*
> *has an operational plan in place and has made necessary system changes*
> *so that the switchover can be made more quickly.*
