A MESSAGE FROM ERNIE CRIST

North Vancouver District staff under the leadership of it's CAO James Ridge has raised an all time high amount for UNITED WAY in this years UNITED WAY Campaign.

The total amount raised this year (2004) was \$22,200. This is by far the largest amount ever raised in any United Way Campaign. The largest amount raised in any previous year was \$15,000. The target for 2004 was \$ 18,000. The total amount raised in 2003 was \$ 11,226. This means that the amount raised in 2004 is nearly double of what was raised in 2003 and well above the target of \$ 18,000 set for 2004 at the beginning of the campaign.

Congratulations are in order to both District Staff and to Mr. Ridge personally. Mr. Ridge made a personal appeal to staff to respond to the challenge - again congratulations.
