Dear: Mayor Janice Harris,

Can we have speed bumps installed on Bendale Rd, 2500 block between Lytton and Berkley Rd. Lately drivers use this quite residential block as a shortcut route between Berkley and Lytton to get to Mt Seymour Parkway. Drivers continuously accelerate through this block at well over the speed limit making the street (Bendale Rd) dangerous for pedestrians and local residences pulling out of driveways. A number of senior citizens live on this street, and the highspeed traffic makes it very hazardous for them especially. The traffic volume is not heavy at all on Bendale Rd, so putting in a couple of speed bumps will not impede traffic or cause any kind of congestion at all, but will slow down the drivers who tend to zip through the street thinking it is some kind of quick short cut.
