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Dear Mayor Walton and Councillor Mackay-Dunn

I have just obtained a copy of next Thursday's agenda for the North Shore Transportation Advisory Committee, of which the two of you are now the District representatives. I note that there are several items under the heading "Translink", one of which is an update on the bus depot.

Should input for this issue by "closed" at the end of next Tuesday's Public Hearing, will the District make a request to have this item taken off the North Shore TAC's agenda? Otherwise, do you intend to leave Thursday evening's meeting when this item is discussed by that committee?

Also on the issue of this fairly new committee, it has become an ongoing frustration for the public to get information on its upcoming meeting dates and locations, agendas in advance of the meeting, background information for the agenda, etc. Could the municipalities involved consider a system whereby the public has access to this type of thing, without having to do a lot of work to get it and then spend further quantities of time relaying the information to interested people? Right now, the City of North Vancouver seems to have the most information on their website, but its not necessarily complete or timely. I wondering whether one municipality could have a "complete" page for information about the committee, and perhaps the other municipalities could just link to it on their sites.
