NSMBA blog site.

I've checked with my Parks staff and there seems to be some miscommunication on the Blog sites. The old Pink Star Fish trail is being decommissioned and the old dangerous

wooden structures are being removed as per the Alpine Plan. It is not being rebuilt. Many times individual Mt Bikers ideas, misinformation or comments show up on the Mt Bike

websites and the streams of conversations on the blogs do not reflect the Alpine formal plans or our agreements with the NSMBA.

I agree with you that Parks staff does need to be vigilante, monitor the trail activities on the mountains and <u>protect</u> the wetlands in Mountain View Park.
