Dear Ms. Rogers and Mr. Knell: We direly need "Trail Calming" in Mountain View Park environs...

This (see below) is the very reason why the following trails coming down the slope from the NEW Fromme parking lot, in the Mtn View Environs, <u>must be</u> <u>decommissioned</u> (see NSMB.com post, below): Lower Griffen Trail (between BP Trail and Natural High Trail), Immonator Trail, Lower Griffen Switchback Trail and Lower Griffen Ascent Trail.

We will see far too much bike traffic, for sure, and <u>further degradation</u> of the "pocket park" and pond, if these <u>four trails</u> remain open to mountain biking! It is only common sense for true "balance of protection and recreation" <u>that was promised</u> several years ago. We are still waiting.

Please give me a <u>very good reason</u> why these trails will not be closed, if this is DNV's position (other than the usual MTBers and NSMBA want them -- aka "no net trail loss", etc. That argument will not suffice). How does mountain dirt biking help to protect such a sensitive area? I don't believe it does. If you are planning to close these trails, it will be the best news I have heard since 2003! *Thank you in advance!*

There are plenty of trails, elsewhere on Fromme, where the MTBers can ride. The situation has changed greatly since 2003, when Mtn View Park was hotly contested. There is <u>no pressing need</u> for MTBers <u>to ride and build more trails</u> (bypasses, realignments, climbing trails, etc.) inside the Mtn View environs, anymore.

Please work to protect this wetland treasure! When are MTBers going to "give back" something they never should have taken in the first place? When will we begin to see real protection, conservation and restoration of this wetland treasure, cared for by various environmental groups? The NSMBA's brand of "care" is frightening! Let's give Mountain View Park a chance! DNV will not regret it. Thank you!
